CANON JOHN PIERT (1928 – 2026 RIP)

Canon John Piert died peacefully last Sunday night in Our Lady's Manor, Dalkey, under the care of the Carmelite Sisters. The sad news filtered through early on Monday morning. His funeral Mass was celebrated in Dalkey on Wednesday with Archbishop Dermot Farrell and Bishop Donal Roche in attendance. His remains were brought to Gowran Cemetery in his native Kilkenny for burial.

May he rest in peace! A goodly number of parishioners from Johnstown, Arklow and Castletown travelled to be present. We deeply appreciate Reverend Nigel Sherwood's generosity in joining us at the Mass.



Fr Piert spent several happy years in Castletown before promotion to Parish Priest in Wicklow town. He came as curate in Johnstown in 1998 and made a deep impression on all of us. He was a wise, caring, and devoted pastor and was much loved. He and his faithful housekeeper Rita were a positive influence on our parish. He was elevated to Canon of the Metropolitan Chapter of the Dublin Archdiocese in 2007 – an honour he greatly appreciated.

Canon Piert was a victim of the restrictions imposed by the health authorities during Covid 19. They required full-time care which he received in Our Lady's Manor. He expressed the wish to return to Johnstown which he did on several occasions.

He joined us in 2022 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of St David's church. In 2023 we celebrated with great joy his 70th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood while Fr John Hayes of Scarnagh just recently deceased celebrated his 60th. Archbishop Dermot Farrell and retired Archbishop Diarmuid Martin did the honour of joining in their unique achievement. The reception for both in Árus Lorcáin was a truly memorable occasion and Canon Piert's speech drew copious applause.

Fr Piert loved his native Kilkenny and up to this year followed their fortunes on the hurling field. It is fitting that his mortal remains will rest in the cemetery at Gowran outside Kilkenny city. We extend our deepest sympathies to his family, to Rita, his housekeeper, and to all who loved him. We hope to mark his passing with a Mass of Remembrance in the next few weeks accompanied by his relations and family.
